

ATTENTION WASHINGTON TOWNSHIP VOTERS!

June 2nd is fast approaching and there are many changes that every voter needs to be aware of before coming out to cast your ballot.

- Mail in Voting. The deadline for applying to receive a mail-in ballot is May 26th so if you have not applied and/or received one, you will have to go to your polling station to vote. If you do have a mail in ballot, it must be received in Greensburg by mail or in person no later than June 2nd. The mail in votes will be counted at the courthouse starting at 9:00 am on June 2nd.
- If you have a mail in ballot and you choose instead to vote in person, you will have to vote provisionally which requires completion of additional paperwork at the polling station.

DUE TO THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC, CDC REGULATIONS MUST BE FOLLOWED. THEY ARE AS FOLLOWS:

- The building capacity is 25 people (which includes poll workers) so be aware that you may have to wait.
- b. Social distancing of 6 feet must be maintained at all times
- c. The polling stations have new voting machines. Every voter will be given a paper ballot and a swab for use on the machines. Poll workers will be available to assist you in acclimating to the new machines. PLEASE keep in mind that your ballot must be inserted into the scanner for your vote to be counted.

Washington Township Coronavirus Emergency Information

Due to the Covid-19 Coronavirus Emergency, Washington Township has decided for the safety and well-being of all of our staff, residents and visitors to limit access to the Township Building.

On **Friday, June 5, 2020, t**here will be a planned power outage to upgrade facilities. The outage will affect **200** customers in the vicinity of Markle Rd, Pine Run Rd, Spring Hollow Rd, and White Cloud Rd in Apollo, PA. Customers will experience a service interruption from approximately **8:00 am to 3:00 pm**.

No accounts identified as "Critical Facilities" will be impacted by this outage.

A call will be made to each customer's phone number as listed on their electric account via the Interactive Voice Response (IVR) system. <u>Customers needing to update their account</u> <u>phone number or having questions about the outage should call the contact center directly at: 1-800-686-0021.</u>



Road Work

Construction will begin on Utopia Road between Route 380 and Crestview Drive on Monday, April 27th and will continue till approximately August 15th, 2020. Road will remain open during construction. Emergency vehicles will always have access.



PROPERTY TAX RELIEF

The Township will follow the Westmoreland County's decision to extend the real estate property tax deadlines.

Payments at the discounted amount will be accepted until August 31, 2020 and the face amount until December 31, 2020.

There has been no extension or waiving of fees granted to the school tax. The normal schedule will apply and will be mailed out August 1, 2020.

Needles and injectable drugs will not be accepted.

TREE TRIMMING NOTIFICATION

The Public Works Department will continue tree trimming as necessary. Tree limbs or shrubs which hang into the right away, in the area beyond the edges of the road and less than 14 feet in height, become a hazard and cause damage to buses and trucks and also interferes with proper snow removal. We would greatly appreciate if all residents trim their trees in this area.

We will try to hand out letters of advance notice if we are in your area. We cannot be held responsible if there is any damage to your trees. If you are concerned with the health of your trees, please either trim them yourselves or hire a qualified tree arborist.

We will also be trimming shrubs and trees that restrict vision at intersections.

Please be aware that our township ordinance prohibits parking on streets. This is especially important during the winter months when the plows need to have access. This will be enforced.




